

NO TEACHER LEFT BEHIND 11

June 11-13, 2012

Mark your calendars now. The No Teacher Left Behind 11 training for 2012 is scheduled for **June 11-13, 2012**. In years past we have offered the following workshops:

NTLB 1 - June 2002

Each teacher who attended all 8 days was paid \$720 plus benefits and received the new equipment. There were 100 participants. Each teacher who attended only the one-day General Awareness Technology training was paid \$90 plus benefits. There were 420 participants.

Each teacher was paid \$360 plus benefits for four days of training and received the new equipment. There were 77 participants.

Each teacher was paid \$270 plus benefits for three days of training and received the new equipment. There were over 40 participants.

NTLB 6 - May 2007

- Behind Business and Industry Tour. NTLB has traditionally provided teachers with technical training and educational tools (see above) that were taken back to the classroom to enhance the experiences of students. For NTLB VI our ACT teachers took to the road to learn all about Manatee County's industry, and what employers need students to learn to prepare them for careers. The group toured some of Manatee County's most progressive business and industry sites including SMR Frams, Beall's Distribution Center, Ameritex, MGA Financial Services, GC Schmitt, Lake Erie College of Medicine (LECOM), SYSCO, Tropicana, Team Edition, Pierce Manufacturing and Manatee Memorial Hospital.

Each teacher was paid \$270 plus benefits for three days of training and. There were over 70 participants.

NTLB 7 - June 2008

- Behind Business and Industry Tour #2. As in NTLB VI we toured more of Manatee County's most progressive business and industry sites to see and hear first hand from employers regarding skill sets needed and new technologies necessary for a successful 21st Century workforce. The tour included visiting the Manatee County Mosquito Control District, Port Manatee, Mosaic, the Bradenton Country Club, MTI's shooting range, Manatee Community College (MCC), Carrabba's, the Sheriff's Command Center, Moffitt Cancer and Research Center

Each teacher was paid \$270 plus benefits for three days of training and received the new equipment. There were over 40 participants

NTLB 8 - June 2009

Four of the seven sessions offered during June were built around intensive preparation for industry certification exams. Three other sessions revolved around using new technology in the classroom and one workshop was for Elementary Engineering teachers.

NTLB 9 - June 2010

13 three day sessions offered during June were built around intensive preparation for industry certification exams. One other session revolved around using new technology in the classroom and one workshop was for Elementary Engineering teachers (Inspiring Elementary Engineering - IE2) that lasted 5 full days.

Each teacher was paid \$90 per day, plus benefits for the training. There were over 75 ACT participants.

NTLB 10 - June 2011

- Behind Business and Industry Tour #3. As in NTLB VI we toured more of Manatee County’s most progressive business and industry sites to see and hear first hand from employers regarding skill sets needed and new technologies necessary for a successful 21st Century workforce. The tour included visiting Lockheed Martin, FELD Entertainment, Lakewood Ranch Planned Community, ASO Corporation, Watercress Farm Myakka City and FCCI Insurance. Additional opportunities during the three days included attending a presentation with guest panelists Deputy County Administrator, Karen Windon; Emergency Services Director for the American Red Cross, Erin Craig; Manatee County Fair Director, Dan West and Dr. Tim McGonegal, Superintendent of Schools. The workshop concluded with a trip to McNeal Elementary to Cheryl McGrew’s Engineering by Design lab where teachers discovered the technology being afforded elementary students in STEM.
- Elementary Engineering

Each teacher was paid \$90 per day, plus benefits for the training and received the new equipment at the elementary engineering workshop. There were over 60 participants in total.
