**Manatee Technical Institute
 Students Win Big**

Once again Manatee Technical Institute students outperformed students around the country demonstrating their career skills and expertise at the SkillsUSA competition held in Kansas City this summer. SkillsUSA is a national non-profit student organization and "a partnership of students, teachers, and industry working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce." SkillsUSA offers secondary and post-secondary students opportunities to grow in their chosen career field in competitions showcasing their career and technical skills at local, state and national events. All competitions, governed with the help of industry, trade associations, and labor organizations, test students' competencies in career and industry standards. "Students work against the clock and each other, proving their expertise in occupations like electronics, computer-aided drafting, precision machining, medical assisting and culinary arts." At this year's event, *Champions at Work*, more than 4,000 contestants from all over the United States competed in more than 80 events.

After winning 46 medals last year, it is no surprise that this year MTI secondary and post secondary students were once again champions among their peers sweeping the competition and bringing home 57 medals –more medals than any other school in the nation. Students competed in a wide variety of events capturing gold, silver and bronze medals. For the first time, the team of Wilmac Jean-Baptiste, Joshua Hoey, and David Bowman won a gold medal in the Automated Manufacturing Technology competition. David Riman, Aasif Khan, and William Scanlon won a bronze medal in the TechPrep-Architecture and Construction competition for their digital thermometer demonstration. Not to be outdone, the Crime Scene Investigation team of Katie Gilbert, Anthony Begley, and Maria Gillum won a gold medal for collecting and presenting evidence from a murder crime scene. Congratulations to these champions and all the teams who represented MTI at SkillsUSA!
